Young children and teens receive professional counseling and participate in recreational activities. These programs are structured to help children develop emotionally, and minimize maladaptive behavior for those at risk. Autistic children and their parents are helped with the emotional and psychological issues that arise with autism.

The immediate needs of those in the midst of grief, crisis or disaster are addressed and defused with care and guidance. During volatile situations response teams are deployed immediately to assess and control crisis reactions. Support services for survivors of suicide and families of overdose victims are provided.
