Family Service League Addresses Homelessness In Suffolk County

First Group Home Opens For Adults Who Were Chronically Homeless



Each resident has a key to his new home.

Opening our first supported housing program for formerly homeless adults, Family Service League is helping to reduce homelessness in Suffolk County. “Permanent supportive housing is the most effective long-term solution for addressing the needs of homeless people,” according to Jo Anne Collins, Ph.D., FSL Division Director for Housing and Homeless Services. “State and federal funding sources, including HUD and OTDA, have made developing housing to meet the needs of chronically homeless people a funding priority.”



One of our residents has not slept in a bed he could call his own in 15 years. Now he proudly makes his own bed every morning. He loves to cook and shares his culinary talents with other residents.



FSL opened a house for six formerly homeless adults in July. Financial and technical support was provided by the New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) Homeless Housing and Assistance Program (HHAP) and the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Message from Our President & CEO

We have been very busy during these first nine months of 2010 helping families throughout Long Island restore hope and rebuild their lives. We now know for certain what every economist had predicted – that 2010 would be a very difficult year. Unprecedented numbers of people are coming to us for help to address problems with debt. We have also seen an increase in the number of families who are left to mourn the loss of a loved one who committed suicide. Thus far in 2010, we have responded to more calls than we did in all of 2009 through Joe's Project; a postvention suicide program to help families. Undoubtedly stressful economic hardships are placing heavy burdens on people which have resulted in them tragically taking their own lives.



This Fall, we will be implementing a very exciting initiative, a Community School, with the Brentwood School District. Thanks to support from the JP Morgan Chase Foundation, we will develop this unique national model to help provide students and their families with the essential supports, protection, guidance and opportunities to succeed. A Community School is an extended service school which combines academics with a wide range of vital in-house services, for the purpose of promoting children's learning and development.

As a result of state and federal grants, we opened our first group home for formerly homeless adults. Our home provides a supportive environment that will enable individuals to live with dignity in the community.

Much has been accomplished, but so much more needs to be done. Many thanks to our Board, staff and generous donors who help us to do what we do each and every day.

County Wide Counseling Assists Hundreds

As we prepare to celebrate FSL's 85th Anniversary in 2011, we can't help but highlight County Wide Counseling, the longest running program at Family Service League. What began as local

Huntington homemakers helping residents with their problems in a tiny office has evolved into a well-respected counseling program which employs thirty (30) highly skilled, knowledgeable licensed clinical social workers and two (2) psychiatric nurse practitioners. County Wide Counseling offers individual, family, couple and group counseling in our four Family Centers located in Bay Shore, Huntington, East Yaphank and Riverhead. In addition to daytime hours, evening and weekend hours are offered to accommodate working families.

According to Janice Gosule, LCSW, Program Director, "people come to us with problems such as parent/child issues, separation/divorce, bereavement,

marital conflicts, economic/financial pressures and emotional stress. In today's tenuous economic environment, many consumers are struggling with the loss of employment frequently leading to family tensions."

Families and Schools Together (FAST) in Five Suffolk County School Districts

Family Service League recently completed FAST program cycles in Longwood, Huntington, William Floyd, Central Islip and the Brentwood School Districts. FAST, developed in 1986 at the University of Wisconsin, is a preventive program designed to reduce drop-out rates and work with parents to keep youngsters drug-free. Targeting families with children in grades K-3 and 6-8, FAST seeks to improve the school-parental relationship which in turn bridges the gap between parents and their children's teachers. The program operates for 8 weeks in the school during the evening, focusing on family centered activities which often include siblings. Parents then continue for an additional 10 months in parent support groups known as FASTWORKS.

Jackie, age 9, lives with her mother Nancy, her 1-year old brother Brett, her 18-year old stepsister, her stepfather and her stepfather's brother. Jackie was initially referred to FAST as she socialized very little with her peers and seemed to have no interest in school. Jackie and Nancy have just completed the FAST 8-week cycle.

As Jackie and her mom were able to participate in enjoyable activities, a new dynamic began to emerge. Nancy learned to become empowered as a parent and the entire family unit became stronger. Jackie is doing better in school with the support of her family.





Operation Success Provides Summer Fun in Riverhead

Operation Success, a youth-program which operates in the Riverhead, Manor Field (Huntington Station) and Iovino South Shore (Bay Shore) Family Centers, assists children who are at risk of falling behind to achieve academic and social success. Supported by a strong volunteer force, the children are helped to complete homework assignments, are mentored in reading, math and other academic skills and have access to computers and software designed to reinforce these skills.

Measures have demonstrated improved academic achievement at all Operation Success sites.

A generous donation from *Stop & Shop* provided fun and educational trips for the children enrolled in Operation Success in Riverhead this summer. Trips to the Vanderbuilt Planetarium, Atlantis Aquarium and Long Island Game Farm Wildlife Park provided new experiences for children often deprived of such adventures. Summer programs focus on helping children maintain skills learned during the school year.

Seniors often have difficulty maintaining their homes, while many young people search for affordable housing on Long Island. Through HomeShare, FSL brings together Senior homeowners with carefully screened home seekers willing to exchange their services for low-cost housing. In addition to physical assistance and added income, the senior citizen enjoys a new sense of companionship, safety and security.

Where Can Families Turn When Crisis Occurs?



If a family faces a lack of food, threat of losing housing, risk of utility shutoff or needs information to assist with other critical financial or family issues, **CAIR Services** are available at our four Family Centers in Riverhead, East Yaphank, Bay Shore and Huntington Station. CAIR offers free walk-in or telephone assistance when individuals or families experience emergencies. Professionally trained staff will assess the needs and link people with resources and assistance. Most of all, CAIR staff work to reduce isolation and stress so people are better able to help themselves overcome challenges and become self-sufficient.

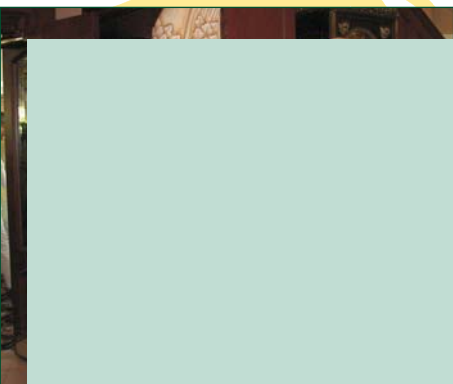
