Looking Ahead to a Bright Future

For over 90 years Family Service League, one of Long Island’s most trusted providers, has continued to evolve and create innovative mental health and addiction treatment solutions which help meet the changing needs of residents. 2020 will carry on the tradition of designing programs offering tangible services which children and adults depend on every day. FSL will strengthen and build upon the most utilized programs to ensure that there is a continued positive impact on the communities we serve. In the coming months, these are just a few ways we are working toward that goal:



- Plans will soon be announced for the opening of FSL’s Fay J. Lindner Health & Wellness Center which is located on FSL’s Iovino Family Center Campus in Bay Shore. The center will offer mental health counseling, substance

abuse treatment, primary care medicine, and Genoa Pharmacy under one roof. This unique facility, operated in medical partnership with Southside Hospital Northwell Health, will improve access to both behavioral health care as well as primary care for residents.

(PROS) Stepping Stones program. PROS offers flexible, individualized services to help adults with serious and chronic mental illness overcome the many barriers they face when trying to attain goals that foster their rehabilitation and recovery.

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- Expansion of the Flexible Employment Program (FEP) due to a generous grant from Capital One Bank. FEP is a comprehensive computer-training program for individuals with disabilities, in which students learn the necessary skills to obtain and maintain competitive employment, as well as developing insight regarding their vocational strengths. The class environment mirrors the workplace to ensure that students are prepared for the structure of integrated employment.

- The PROS Stepping Stones program launched a new partner program with Island Harvest Food Bank. This service will help our most vulnerable clients who are found to be lacking in resources and food. The program is designed to increase awareness about the importance of good nutrition. Participation in weekly Nutrition Education Workshops will discuss ways to improve health and combat disease, especially high blood pressure, obesity, and diabetes.

- Therapy dogs will be working with clients in the Personalized Recovery Oriented Services

- Crisis Care - DASH is Long Island's only 24/7/365 facility offering immediate care for those in the throes of crisis facing the challenges of mental health, substance addiction, or trauma. More details on page 3.

DASH is Long Island's only 24 hour, 7 day a week, year round crisis care center which provides vital and immediate care to Suffolk County residents who are struggling with mental health and addictive disorders.

FSL's Diagnostic, Assessment, and Stabilization Hub (DASH) is a unique treatment model and healthcare service that both saves lives and improves quality of life for those in crisis. The DASH Team includes nurse practitioners in psychiatry, registered nurses, social workers, credentialed alcoholism and substance abuse counselors, and peer specialists. This innovative healthcare option is available for children (5 years or older), adolescents, and adults. In an effort to comfort and build a foundation of support, those seeking help may have family and loved ones accompany them to DASH where they may stay for up to 24 hours. The DASH spectrum of care often includes working with individuals fraught with suicidal thoughts, severe depression, anxiety, overwhelming stress, drug or alcohol abuse, hearing voices, erratic behavior, extreme family or interpersonal conflicts, and workplace or school trauma. All are life-altering, often debilitating challenges that cannot be faced alone - DASH provides immediate help.

The goal of DASH crisis intervention is to provide quality care while reducing unnecessary use of emergency departments, inpatient care, and criminal justice services. FSL was able to turn this vision of



care into a reality that is making a tangible impact on our Long Island neighbors.

Since the opening of DASH in March 2019, the facility has become an essential source of crisis care and a beacon of hope for those in need.

- Over 3,000 individuals (60% under the age 18) have been treated and provided with support on their journey to a better life.
- The DASH hotline (631-952-3333) has received over 10,000 calls.
- The Mobile Response Team (MRT) division of DASH delivers much needed portable crisis care and has assessed over 700 individuals by responding to locations throughout the community such as schools, businesses, and private residences.

Our work in the community has given us insight into the challenges of mental health crises and substance abuse, both issues know no socio-economic barrier and these epidemics are destroying lives across Long Island. FSL is looking to replicate this model to reach even more residents in crisis in the near future. This newly created DASH program is another facet of how FSL is assisting our neighbors by helping to *Restore Hope and Rebuild Lives*.

DASH and the continuum of crisis services are made possible by the continued collaboration and support of Suffolk County's Division of Community Mental Hygiene, the Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services (OASAS), and the New York Office of Mental Health.

FSL's Continuing Education Courses offer quality curriculum which is designed using the latest techniques and strategies that focus on the real world applications impacting our communities today. North Fork Schools & FSL Team Up

North Fork School Districts

and FSL have teamed up to launch a new wellness initiative as a resource to help manage mental health, crisis intervention, and other student support services for children (over 5 years old), teens, and their families. FSL will work with the North Fork multi-district consortium to provide vital treatment and therapeutic support for students residing throughout the North Fork of

Long Island. The professional staff, which includes psychiatrists, social workers, and mental health professionals, work in coordination with local schools, hospitals, and the community to offer comprehensive evaluations, counseling, educational workshops, therapy, and medication management in a confidential and supportive environment. NY State Senator Ken LaValle, Assemblyman Anthony Palumbo, and Southold Town Supervisor Scott Russell spearheaded the grant in an effort to support the needs of students. Long Island Sound Senior Care in Greenport

The **Long Island Sound Senior Care** (LISSC) is a new, no cost program designed for residents of Greenport over age 60 and is the region's newest Naturally Occurring Retirement Communities (NORC) program. Greenport qualifies as a Neighborhood NORC because of its high proportion of individuals over age 60 who have naturally aged in place. With funding from **New York State Office for the Aging**, along with the **Town of Southold** and **Stony Brook Eastern Long Island Hospital** as key partners, FSL will provide a multitude of no cost services and programs to help seniors. The goals of the program include reducing isolation, increasing access to healthcare, and improving the overall quality of life for those seniors who have chosen to remain in their home. New FREE services include assistance in accessing and navigating both

healthcare and social service systems, help applying for benefits, finding medical providers, traveling to appointments, transportation to social/recreational activities, and more. LISSC will create opportunities for seniors to socialize, volunteer,

and remain active participants in their community. An additional aspect of this grant encourages Greenport residents of all ages to lend their voice in developing programming by inviting them to join the **LISSC Advisory Committee**.

Caregiver Support Free individual counseling, support groups, and educational seminars for those caring for someone 60+ years of age. HomeShare Home Owners, 55 + years of age, are carefully matched with Home Seekers, 18+ years of age to share a single family home. HomeShare rents are well below market and may be further reduced if the

Home Owner requires assistance with errands and/or a variety of tasks around the home. Companionship and a sense of security are just a few of the many benefits of home sharing. HomeShare is primarily funded by the townships of Babylon, Islip, and Huntington. 631-650-1461

Nursing Home Transition & Diversion (NHTD) If you're eligible for Medicaid and in need of nursing home services you may be able to stay in the community through NHTD program. Individuals must be screened by Suffolk Independent Living Organization (SILO), contact 631-320-1662 for eligibility.

Long Term Care Ombudsmen (LTC) LTC Ombudsmen provide advocacy and resources for people who reside in long-term care facilities such as nursing homes, assisted living, and adult care facilities. Ombudsmen help residents and their families understand and exercise their rights to quality care and quality of life. The program advocates for residents by receiving concerns, investigating, and working to resolve complaints made by or on behalf of residents.
