In partnership with over twenty-eight congregations throughout the township of Huntington, FSL regularly outreaches to those who are chronically homeless – people living on the streets, in parks, and other public locations. Through the Huntington Interfaith Homeless Initiative (HIHI), we are able to facilitate access to shelter during the winter months for individuals who are unable or unwilling to access Suffolk County's shelter system. HIHI consists of over 1,000 volunteers - all of whom work together to provide respite, warmth, food, and clothing to those most vulnerable.

Christ Church of Oyster Bay, one of the founding supporters of this critical initiative, in total has donated over \$150,000. Gifts like this allow us to further our work of ensuring the health and safety of those who are struggling.
